8. Noun Adjective as pre-modifier: Two nouns side by side and an adjective in front of the first noun is used as pre-modifier.

Example:

- 1. I have bought a small tea pot.
- 2. Gabtali is a **busy bus stand.**
- 3. Shadowy mango tree

Post- Modifier

Infinitive Phrase as Post Modifier:

Infinitive:(To+V1: base/present form of verb)

To go, to buy, to see, to talk

Example:

- I. His plan to start the business ended in smoke.
- II. His scheme to found a hospital did not come true.

Found-founded-founded Find- found-found

2. Present Participle (V1+ing) & Past Participle (V3) as Post Modifier:

Example:

- I. I saw the porter <u>lying/sleeping</u> on the floor.
- II. He found the girl <u>reading</u> a book.
- III. The book <u>published</u> in1993 has been revised.
 - IV. The letter <u>signed</u> by the principal was posted.

3. Prepositional Phrase as Post Modifier:

Example:

- a. The boy in torn cloth is very poor.
- b. The man on board the ship was clever.
